Personal Statement (Not Required for Self-Advocate Applicants)

The CA-LEND training program aims to recruit fellows with a diverse range of experiences, backgrounds, and perspectives and who represent diverse intersectional identities. Each applicant is asked to submit a brief personal statement, no more than two pages.

Please consider including the following:

- (1) your professional and personal philosophy, short- and long-term career goals, and how involvement in the CA-LEND training program will help you achieve these goals
- (2) information about your experience or work with children, families and persons with neurodevelopmental disabilities, including the diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder, or chronic health conditions
- (3) an example from your personal or professional life that highlights your leadership capacity and/or potential
- (4) your interest in the fellowship and what you hope to learn/gain from the experience

You are welcome to include any other information you would like to share with us.

Interest Questions (Required ONLY for Self-Advocate Applicants)

Because our Self-Advocacy Trainees have credentials that are based on life experience and possibly formal schooling, we would like to get some information from you about your background. Please limit personal statements to no more than two pages.

- (1) How would you describe self-advocacy personally and professionally?
- (2) Please tell us about a time where you advocated for yourself or another person.
- (3) How many years of experience, either paid or unpaid, do you have in providing positive change in the community?
